CHOREOGRAPHER CHASE BROCK SIGNS WITH JOHN BUZZETTI AT WILLIAM MORRIS ENDEAVOR ENTERTAINMENT

Choreographer Chase Brock has signed with John Buzzetti at William Morris Endeavor Entertainment. Buzzetti will be responsible for Brock's theater, television, film, opera and video game work.

The 27-year-old dance-maker, who recently created the choreography for the best-selling Wii game "Dance on Broadway," has a career that straddles many worlds. His theater choreography includes the world premiere of "Yank!," Mark Lamos's revival of "A Little Night Music," and Jeff Calhoun's revival of "Shenandoah."

Television credits include "Broadway Under the Stars" for CBS and the Joan As Police Woman music video "Eternal Flame." In July, he restaged his choreography for Bartlett Sher's 2008 production of "Roméo et Juliette," which was performed at the 2010 Salzburg Festival and will move to Teatro alla Scala in June 2011. His choreography has also been featured on film in "Clear Blue Tuesday," which played at New York's Quad Cinema in September.

Brock has created more than 20 dances for The Chase Brock Experience, the Brooklyn-based contemporary dance company he founded in 2006. The 13-member company completed a well-touted one-week run at the Connelly Theater in New York this past July, marking its sixth New York season in four years.

Buzzetti's other theater dance clients at William Morris include Andy Blankenbuehler ("In the Heights"), Stephen Hoggett ("American Idiot"), and Jonathan Butterrell ("The Light in the Piazza").
