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CIRCUS ON A BICYCLE

CIRQUE MECHANICS'S 'PEDAL PUNK' MAKES NEW YORK DEBUT AT THE NEW VICTORY THEATER, DECEMBER 4-JANUARY 3

Circuses conventionally take place in tents or on stages, but Cirque Mechanics's "Pedal Punk" which receives its New York City premiere at The New Victory Theater, December 4-January 3, commandeers the wildly eccentric Gantry, a giant bicycle-like contraption and its various deconstructed parts, for the show's non-stop crazy antics.

For the daring, witty band of eleven clowns, contortionists, trampolinists, dancers and tricksters, no part of a bicycle is sacred as they climb, cavort and fly with the greatest of ease demonstrating that simple things can be the giver of great pleasure. No technology necessary is the credo.

Weighing in at 3000 pounds (including artists aboard) the Gantry steers like a bulldozer or tank, but can be pedaled about by just two people, and has a top speed of five miles per hour. The stage is littered with theatrical gadgetry made from bicycle parts that were reconstructed, or recycled, so to speak.

The show is conceived and directed by Cirque du Soleil alum Chris Lashua who says that he spent most of his career on a BMX (bicycle motocross). His passion and fascination with all things bicycle, and by extension the synergy between man and machine, is at the heart and soul of Cirque Mechanics' productions. The imaginative use of the Gantry bike, a self-contained pedal driven mechanical stage upon which Lashua continues to add newly designed, inventive pedal dependent devices, is another example of Lashua's restless mechanical genius.
